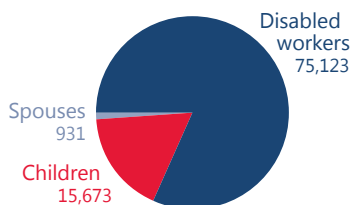
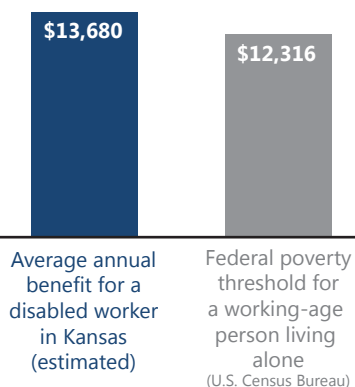




## Most DI beneficiaries in Kansas are disabled workers
